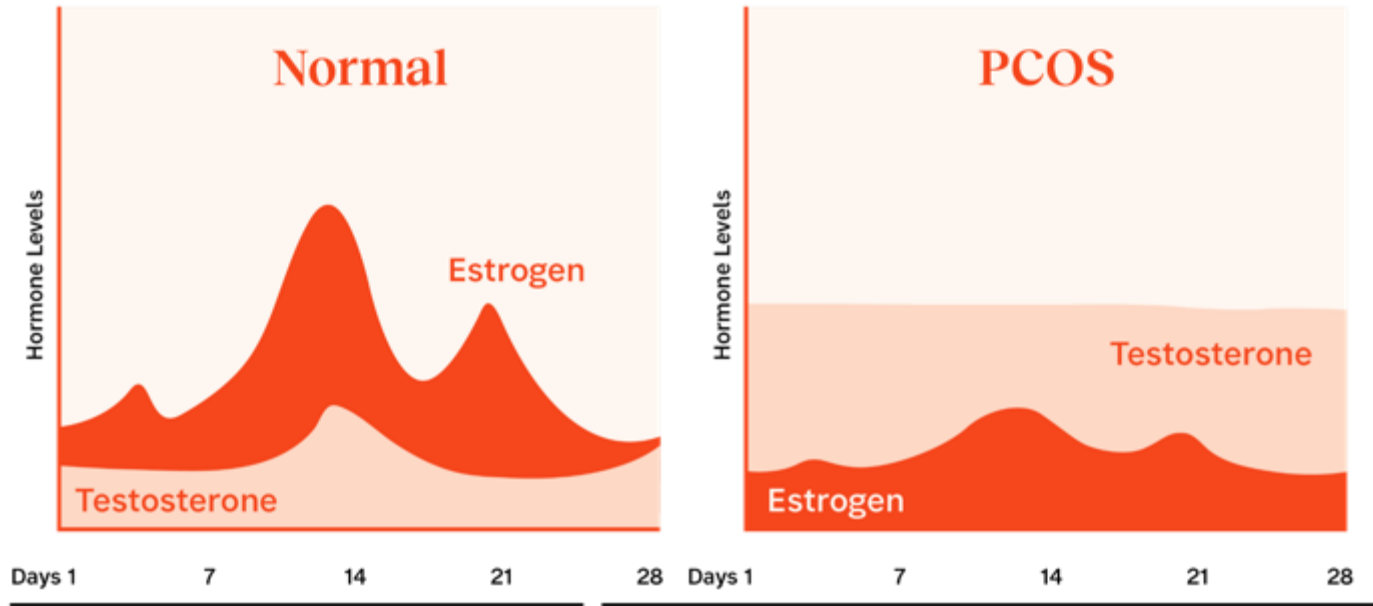
Who does PCOS affect?

Prevalence of Major Medical Conditions for Women	
PCOS	12.5%
Breast Cancer	12%
Diabetes	11%
Endometriosis	10%
Heart Disease	6%

PCOS: up to 20% prevalence



What is going on?



Syndrome marked by over-production of androgens which impacts follicle development & ovulation, but it is much more than reproductive health

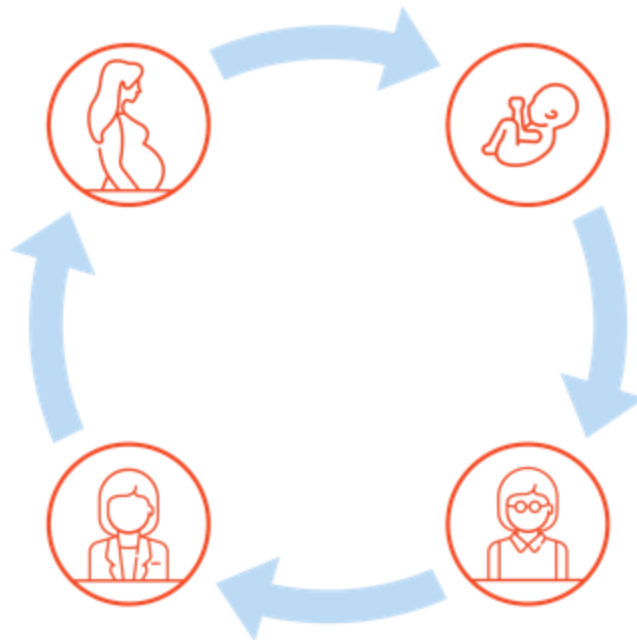
PCOS is > infertility

Pregnancy

- Gestational Hypertension
- Gestational Diabetes
- Pre-eclampsia
- Preterm birth

Adulthood

- **Infertility**
- Insulin Resistance/Weight Mgmt
- **Type 2 Diabetes**
- Depression/Anxiety
- Cardiovascular Risk
- Endometrial Cancer



In Utero

- CNS Programming
- Epigenetic Changes
- Excess Androgen Exposure

Adolescence

- Insulin Resistance/Weight Gain
- Acne/Hirsutism
- Irregular Menstruation

‘Treatments’ include oral contraceptives, lifestyle modifications (GLP-1s), hair removal, acne. None address the underlying overproduction of androgens.

Introducing Ovarian Rebalancing



CAUTION: Investigational device. Limited by United States law to investigational use. Exclusively for clinical investigations.

A targeted product designed to mimic egg retrieval access and deliver ~ 5% ablation.

Ovarian Rebalancing: Results to Date



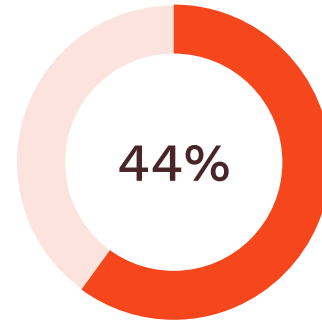
Europe

- 5 sites in FR, BE & UK

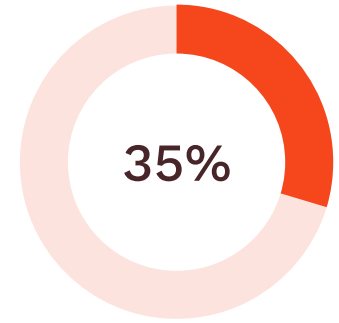


US Feasibility

More options for patients they already have in their practice

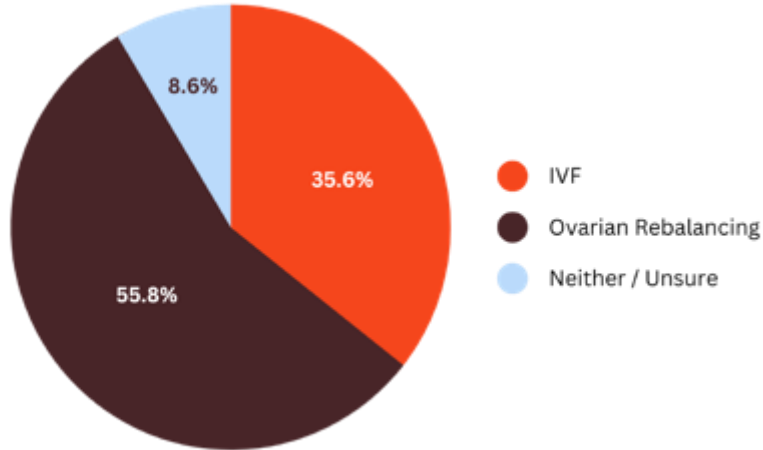

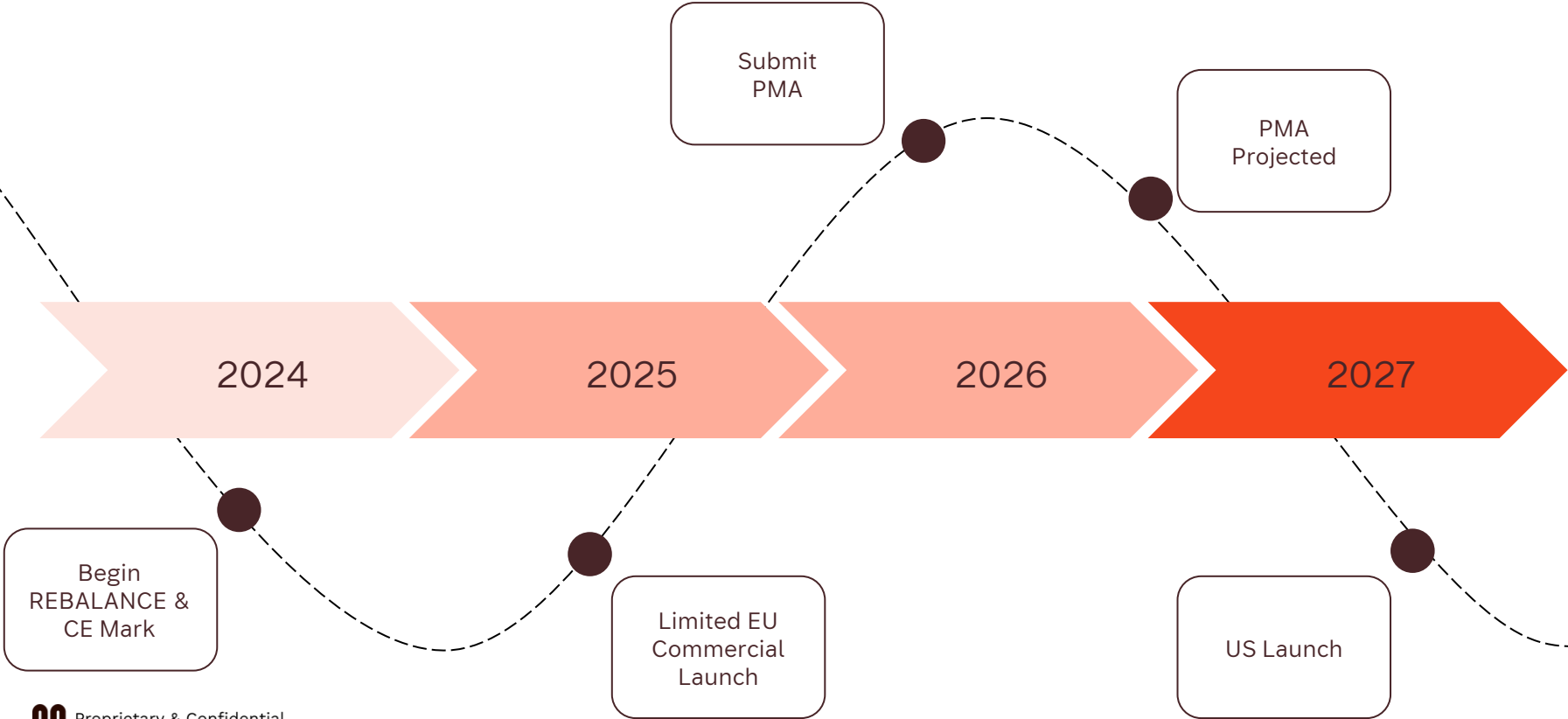
